Tripping or falling – hidden stone work, loose grave stones, loose masonry, uneven ground	Wear eye protectors; ensure no-one else is near when using the mower. Minimum 18 years of age using the equipment. Be aware of surroundings. Wear appropriate gloves/ear defenders	volunteers	ongoing
Emptying public litter bins	Volunteer	Injury to back. Cuts from contents.	Don't attempt to lift; sort from ground between recyclable / non-recyclable contents. Wear appropriate gloves	volunteers	ongoing
Clearing fallen leaves	Volunteer	Back injury	Never overreach when using rake. Use long handled grabber to load bin. When cleaning entrance to undercroft, sweep leaves /debris to bottom before loading bin. Be aware of surroundings.
